- Voiselle Higgins suggested that when we go on rides, we need emergency contact information and medical information with us on the ride. He created something that can be stored in a secure location on your bike if

- needed. John Bull also indicated that there are commercial kits available for purchase that can secure that sort of information.
- President Hope reminded members that it was renewal time and encouraged everyone to complete their renewals early. He also asked the members to fill out the renewal form to ensure that all of their information was accurate.
- President Hope has begun working on the chapter's calendar. He asked that members provide input on any rides that they would like to take this upcoming season.

• Eric Mines spoke to the group about tires. He explained that the day before the Wildwood, NJ ride, he was doing his routine bike check and was going to top off his tank when he felt something unusual as he started to ride. Eric turned around and went back to his where he discovered that he had a knot in the back tire as big as his hand. The tire had good tread but had developed dry rot. The tire date was 2016. After doing some research, he discovered that Dunlap tires do not recommend using/keeping a motorcycle for more than six to ten years. The wide span date is due to ideal conditioning and the use of the tires during that span of time (keeping the bike in a climate-controlled location off the ground during winter, checking tire pressures regularly, etc.). Eric suggested that you check the age of your tires and explained how you can find that information, which is located on the sidewall of the tire.

• The ride committee members were absent and provided no information to be presented at the meeting.
